More children who were born with a single ventricle heart and have a Fontan circulation are growing into adulthood. For these patients, close monitoring is very important. Their circulations often become vulnerable to a variety of health issues as they grow. At our clinic, we use preventive strategies that can help expose treatable problems early. This helps us monitor patients' heart health, preserve liver and kidney health and address other organ systems that are impacted.

## **HOW WE'RE DIFFERENT**

The Fontan Management Clinic is a multidisciplinary clinic that is part of the Cincinnati Children's Adult Congenital Heart Disease (ACHD) Program. Our team offers a coordinated approach that addresses both pediatric and adult patients' complex needs, including:

- Integrated care for single-ventricle patients from specialists caring for multiple organ systems
- An active surveillance program to improve quality and length of life, which includes early detection strategies and therapeutic and preventive approaches that may be lifesaving for patients
- Thoughtful approaches to health concerns that stem from the Fontan circulation such as liver disease, sleep disturbance and sleep apnea
- Highly specialized interventions, such as left ventricular assist devices, total artificial hearts, and both heart and heart-liver transplantation
- Extensive education and coping strategies for patients and their families
- Focus on healthy lifestyle, including balanced diet and exercise
- Palliative and quality-of-life therapies when symptoms return, including diagnostic and invasive cardiac catheterization

Cincinnati Children's is a pioneer and leader in Fontan care, playing a major role in spearheading the Fontan Outcomes Network, a nationwide learning network focused on improving outcomes for people with a Fontan circulation.

## TREATMENT APPROACH

Primary prevention through early detection and treatment, including cardiac and pulmonary rehabilitation, are the mainstays of the Fontan Management Clinic. Our Fontan Management team brings together specialists from a variety of backgrounds to provide the best care possible for adults with congenital heart disease. The clinical team collaborates on individual care, so patients receive care that is coordinated and convenient at each visit. Our team includes specialists from:

- Cardiology
- Diagnostic and Interventional Radiology
- Endocrinology
- Gynecology
- Heart Failure and Transplantation
- Hematology and Thrombophilia
- Hepatology

- Heart and Liver Transplant Surgery

We also work closely with the Heart Institute's Single Ventricle Interstage Clinic to provide a smooth transition for children from the pediatric to adult program.

## PREGNANCY AND FONTAN

It is possible to be pregnant and have a successful birth after having a Fontan operation. However, it may be too risky for some women. Our ACHD specialists have experience working with women and their maternal-fetal medicine teams before and during pregnancy and in the months afterward.

## **HEART-LIVER TRANSPLANTATION**

Due to the impact the Fontan circulation has on both the heart and liver, heart-liver transplants may be the only alternative to palliative care for some of these patients. Cincinnati Children's partners with UC Health to offer seamless care and world-renowned expertise for single ventricle patients needing a heart-liver transplant. Our joint Heart-Liver Transplant Program combines the knowledge and skill of specialists in the Fontan Management Clinic and UC Health Transplant Program.
